Assist the person to experience a sense of achievement. This is important as it will help to increase confidence and self-esteem as well as help them recover their sense of identity post brain injury. Assist the person to feel valued within their family and/or wider community. This can be facilitated by providing the person with a specific role/job.

Additional Interventions to Support Positive Behaviour ...

People with TBI showing signs of these behavior problems should be evaluated by a doctor so they can receive proper treatment. On top of medical intervention, friends and family of survivors should also actively participate in rehabilitation, recovery, and advocacy. 1. Set Realistic Expectations. The complex nature of traumatic brain injury outcomes and possible accompanying injuries might require the neurological physiotherapist to use core skills like facilitation, therapeutic exercises or physical activity prescription, but also to clinically reason and apply the knowledge of therapeutic interventions and strategies from other specialities, eg. respiratory care, orthopaedic and trauma protocols, behaviour de-escalation techniques, communication strategies, equipment provision, etc.

Behavioral interventions for moderate to severe TBI typically include CBT delivered as components of comprehensive, multidisciplinary rehabilitation treatment. In general strong evidence supports the efficacy of CBT for treating panic and agoraphobia and social phobia following Traumatic brain Injury (TBI).

Cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT) was the most widely used approach for treatment of (sub)clinical mental disturbances (41.9%). Neuropsychological interventions were scarce (4.8%).

Behavioral analysis techniques are also used in rehabilitative therapies, helping TBI patients relearn basic tasks of self-care and daily living, and teaching vocational and social skills. In TBI cases, ABAs have to work closely with other medical professionals in orchestrating treatments.
